1.1 – Curriculum Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 – Institution has the mechanism for well planned curriculum delivery and documentation. Explain in 500 words

The vision and mission of Dev Samaj College of Education for Women, Ferozepur is to empower young women from all strata of society by imparting holistic education thereby enabling them to make informed choices and become culturally accomplished citizens who will uphold the values enshrined in the College. For any educational institute, curriculum serves as a foundation for all the teaching-learning processes. This criterion focuses on the curricular aspects of planning and implementation, their enrichment and the feedback system in the college. While the academic curriculum and its calendar are governed by the University, the curriculum delivery involves ameliorating introspection and

sustained implementation of the academic planning and execution over a period of time. The college level committees prepare guidelines and frameworks to suit the requirements of B.Ed. and M.Ed. courses. Formulation of teaching workload, identification of the total number of teaching days, preparation of term wise syllabi, lesson plans, tutorial, question paper setting, continuous assessment and evaluation, identifying ability levels of students, developing performance based action plans and other allied teaching pedagogies are planned, implemented and enriched keeping in mind the objective of achieving academic excellence. The college also provides feedback to the university through its faculty members who are also active members of the Board of Studies and various academic councils of the university, in the form of recommendations for curriculum development and designing. The college prepares the Academic Calendar well in advance, plans the co-curricular and extra-curricular activities in such a manner that the total teaching days are effectively managed without sacrificing the aim of holistic development of students. The subject allocation is done and communicated to faculty members prior to the start of academic session so that the faculty can prepare their lesson plans well in time. The faculty is facilitated by a conducive environment which augments research, study and innovative teaching methods through the provision of spacious classrooms including smart classrooms, a fully automated Wi-Fi campus connectivity, computers, for practical work and Seminar Room to assist pedagogic efforts. We were introduced in the college with the aim of facilitating employability and inculcating global competencies among students. Holistic development of the students is facilitated through the concerted efforts of NSS, various activities in the adopted village Habibke which organize workshops, literary competitions, group discussions, projects, Fields visits, seminars, talks by experts and educational trip etc. The Placement Cell of the college conduct sessions to equip students for interviews and other soft skills honing their employability spectra from whatsapp add due to the Pandemic situation. The college encourages faculty members to attend Orientation/Refresher courses, workshops and present papers in seminars conducted by the affiliating and other Universities for acquiring necessary skills for effective delivery of the curriculum. The college follows a practice of result analysis and online feedback collection. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell, the Principal meetings regularly assess the feedback and make suggestions for institutional improvements. The goals and objectives of the

In addition to this suggestions are welcomed from the students in person and through slipping in their suggestions or grievances in the boxes provided at various points in the Institution. Feedback is invited from faculty on aspects related to curricular aspects orally. Every decision to be taken by the institution is done with the full participation of the faculty members. From the various feedback received, the analysis is carried out on the changes to be made in curriculum, teaching and evaluation. Yearly meetings are held with the Heads of various teaching practice schools to obtain the feedback on the performance of our student-teachers who undertook teaching internship in these schools. Apart from giving their open feedback, suggestions are also offered by the School Principals and based on the feedback given, modifications are incorporated. The Students ever present to represent the student body and more so that the suggestions and feedback given by the heads of the practice teaching schools are made known to the students also. The Parent Teacher Association does play an active role in the decision making of the institution. Meetings are held with the parents to discuss the progress of the students and the functioning of the institution. Suggestions are welcomed from parents too on curricular aspects through feedback forms. The Alumni Association also provides its support and expertise when needed in the conduct of various programmes in the institution. They render their feedback on curricular aspects through online feedback forms. Institution is more a yardstick and checks on the overall development of the institution through meetings. In order to ensure constant growth of the institution and progress of the students we have put an effective feedback mechanism in place that collects, analyses and implements suggestions from the students to make academic, infrastructural and policy improvements in the college. The analysis of such feedback done on an institutional level and in case of any grievance the appropriate initiative and enquiry proposes suitable action to be taken by the Principal. The college has also made many infrastructural improvements to provide bigger and better equipped classrooms to the students and fulfil all necessary requirements of space. 2.3.2 - Students mentoring system available in the institution? Give details. (maximum 500 words)

Students mentoring system is available in the institution to help fresh pupil teachers understand the challenges and opportunities present in the institute and develop smooth transition to campus life. It counsels students in academic work and plays an important role in helping those students who are in trouble to cope with extra academic and personal problems. Student mentoring system provides positive role models to first year students in the institution and proactively tries to identify problems of the general student populace and brings them to the notice of the concerned authorities. Student mentors are respected, well-balanced students usually belonging to 2nd year B.Ed. and M.Ed. courses. The first year students can discuss their problems with the faculty members as well as with 2nd year students. Faculty members meet students regularly. Personal counselling is provided by the faculty member in adjusting to the environment and helping them in overcoming any problem. By providing information, guidance and encouragement, mentors can play an important role in nurturing students' college aspirations. Mentoring for students in college helps to feel more connected and engaged in campus, which can ultimately improve student outcomes. In our college, in tutorial groups, the students discuss their personal, social, emotional, educational and vocational problems with their mentors. Mentors try to solve their all types of problems. Positive attitude is developed in students by providing every help to them by their mentors. All teachers work for the welfare of the students. The mentoring system is a continuous process till the end of the academic session. Through the mentoring system in the college, teacher-student relationship is enhanced in the college, academic performance of students is enhanced, students' dropout ratio is minimized, sense of discipline and regularity is monitored in students and the parents can know about the performance of regularity of their wards through mentoring system. The IQAC of the college has taken the initiative of implementing the mentoring of students. They are divided into groups of 15-20 students. It is the practice of mentors to meet students individually or in groups. In personal cases, parents are called in the college for their meeting with the principal at the suggestion of the mentor. If a student is identified as having weakness in a particular subject, it is the duty of the mentor to apprise the concerned subject teacher. At least three or four meetings are arranged by mentors for their mentees in each semester. This system has been useful in identifying slow learners and through a careful examination of each mentor's report, the college organizes 'Remedial Classes' in identified topics. Every mentor of the college has to keep the phone numbers and email addresses of their students. They also create a Whatsapp group of their students. If the students want to discuss anything regarding syllabus or other activities, they can message in their group and get suitable response. Teachers send the records of class tests, attendance records, records of students' marks in house examination in these groups. 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2.5.2 - Reforms initiated on Continuous Internal Evaluation(CIE) system at the institutional level (250 words)

The college follows the Continuous Internal Evaluation norms of P.U., Chandigarh. The evaluation of each course contains two parts: internal or insemester assessment and external or end-semester assessment. Schedule of internal evaluation is communicated to students and faculty members in the beginning of the semester by the principal. The house examination is also conducted semester wise, evaluation and sessional work is done by the subject teachers concerned. Every student of B.Ed. and M.Ed. is given assignments in all the subjects. Seminars are also conducted semester wise. The performance of students in class tests, house tests, and assignments is monitored by the teacher's in-charge. The college sends progress report of students to their

parents or guardian so that they can help their wards to improve their performance if needed. Evaluation is done on the following points- • Development of social skills • Knowledge of subject matter • Seminars • Assignments • Terminal exams • Different competition • Practical subjects' evaluation • School internship evaluation • Educational tours and short trips • Class tests The students also discuss their problem with each other to get suitable solution. In this way their performance in practical and class/house test improved. Results of practical examination and theory exams are declared within time. As per the guidelines, the following reforms have been carried out effectively in CIE : • Scheduling of internal examination, hall invigilators listed for every examination. • Preparing the question paper for the internal examination in the prescribed pattern. • Scrutiny of the prepared question paper is carried out by the subject experts to ensure quality of the question paper. • Internal assessment has to be carried out within the stipulated time. • After completion of the internal examination, the faculty members evaluate the answer scripts and distribute to the students for doubt clarification or re- correction. • Result review meetings are conducted with students and Principal for remedial actions for further improvements. • Uploading of assessment marks in university web portal.

Academic calendars are systems by which we can define the landmark dates that drive much of the day-to-day activities at the academic institution. Each academic calendar consists of cancel, withdrawal and drop deadline along with other landmark dates that vary depending on the academic calendar type. An academic calendar is to keep students and faculty reminded of key dates throughout the academic semester and year. Academic Calendar contains much more than starts and end dates for classes i.e. B.Ed. and M.Ed. Each educational institution creates its own academic calendar with their own defined dates. It is prepared before the commencement of new session by the IQAC team. It contains schedule of activities i.e. orientation week of B.Ed. students, orientation of M.Ed. students, celebration of Teachers Day, Talent Hunt Programme, Tree plantation, Cleanliness of College Campus, Dry and Fresh Flower Arrangement, Celebration of Hindi Diwas, Poem Recitation and Poster Making Competition, Cultural Heritage competition at college level, Schedule of Micro and Demonstration lessons, Schedule of Holidays, House Tests, Class Tests, Seminars, celebration of important days, scheme of seminars for B.Ed. and M.Ed. PG Diploma in Guidance and Counselling students. Pre internship, Lohri Celebration, Educational Tour, Field Attachment/Internship of M.Ed., Annual Sports Day, Visit to Slum Areas, Visit to Red Cross School, PCP classes, P.U. Skill-in-Teaching and On The Spot Preparation of Teaching Aids' Competitions, Practical and Theory exams of B.Ed., M.Ed. and PG Diploma in GC. Winter Summer vacations for all the Colleges of Education affiliated to Panjab University, Chandigarh. Internal assessment schedule, Publication of College Magazine, Submission of Articles for different sections i.e. Hindi, English, Punjabi, Social Studies, Science, Math's etc. by the students and staff. Online teaching, Seminars, Webinars, NSS Activities, Faculty Development Programme and Other co-curricular activities were also included in academic calendar.
