

ABOUT DEV SAMAJ

The Dev Samaj (a unique religious movement) was founded in 1887 by the Most Worshipful Bhagwan Dev Atma. LIBRARY

To inculcate habit of self-study, the college has a well-equipped fully automated library, with more than thousand volumes. Apart from text books, there are encyclopedias, dictionaries, text books, research journals, monographs, periodicals, dissertations (M.Ed., M.Phil., Ph.D.), magazines and newspapers. During the academic session, latest books in various subjects are regularly added in the Library. The students are expected to make maximum use of the library.

LIBRARY RULES:

- Three books will be issued for 15 days to each student.
- These books must be renewed after two weeks and four weeks by the students and staff respectively. When you borrow the books from the library check them thoroughly, after you have got them issued in your name then it is your responsibility to return them in proper form.
- Each student will be issued a library / identity card . The books will be issued on this card . The card is non transferable.
- · If the library / identity card is lost, a new card will be issued.
- Book Bank Facility Each student will be provided 3-4 books for the whole session.
- · Computers with Internet facilities are available for the students.

HOSTEL

The hostel facility on the campus makes it easy for the students to find a home away from their home. Because of the effective and able management and also for providing safe and healthy environment, parents prefer to send their wards to the hostel of this college. The college hostel is located within the college campus. The modern amenities are provided to the hostlers. Students are trained to live cooperative and democratic life in a disciplined manner. Campus operates its own Mess providing hygienic and nutritious meals with a varied menu.

HOSTEL RULES

Every boarder is required to observe the following rules during his/her stay in the hostel:-

- 1. The accommodation in the Hostels is provided on first come first serve basis.
- 2. While making allotment of seats in the hostel, preference is given to the students coming from far off places.
- 3. Use of intoxicants, smoking and drinking in the Hostels is strictly prohibited. Any boarder found drunk or drinking and smoking in the hostels will be immediately expelled from the hostel.
- 4. The students seeking hostel need to fill up a separate proforma available in the college office.

POSTGRADUATE DIPLOMA IN GUIDANCE AND COUNSELLING (PGDGC)

Rules and Regulations for Admission In Post Graduate Diploma In Guidance & Counselling

Postgraduate Diploma in Guidance and Counselling will enable the students to:

- The Post Graduate Diploma aims to create a supportive and collaborative learning environment for students from diverse backgrounds and cultures to acquire knowledge, attitudes, and skills essential in the practice of guidance and counselling. The course will also help the students to become exemplary in applying essential guidance and counselling knowledge and skills in a variety of settings with individuals from diverse back grounds. The no. of available seats in this course are 40. The admission to this course will take place in the first week of July.
- The minimum qualification for admission to first semester of the course shall be a Bachelor/ Postgraduate degree in any discipline of the university or a degree of any other university which has been recognized by the university equivalent thereto with not less than 50% marks in the aggregate.
- Provided that in case of candidates having Bachelor degree of the university through modern Indian languages (Hindi/Urdu/Punjabi (Gurumukhi script) and or in a classical language (Sanskrit/Persian/Arabic) or degree of any other university obtained in the same manner recognized by the syndicate, 50% marks in the aggregate shall be calculated by taking into account full percentage of marks in all the papers in language, excluding the additional optional paper, English and the elective subject taken together.
- Preference will be given to the candidates possessing Bachelor of Education (B.Ed), Nursery Teacher Training (NTT) or ETT (with a B.A. Degree).
- The minimum number of marks to pass the examination in each semester shall be -35% in each paper in the university examination separately as well as jointly with internal assessment; 35% in the seminar, project and viva-voce; 50% in the aggregate of (i) and (ii) above.
- Grace marks shall be given @ one percent of the aggregate marks of the university examination for each semester. A candidate may avail the grace marks either in the aggregate or in one or more papers as the case may be to his advantage. Grace marks shall, however, be given only for passing the examination or for earning the higher division and not for passing the examination with distinction.
